

 - Several NGO's, local and international under one Umbrella Body-The Water and Environmental Sanitation Network (WESNET)




MoWS Structure - Technical

- Newly formed Ministry
- Aim at achieving universal access to safe water and sanitation
- Guiding blocks
 - Malawi 2063
 - Malawi first 10 year
 Implementation Plan (MIP-1)
 - SDG 6

STATUS OF THE MINISTRY OF WATER AND SANITATION



- Policy and strategic Frameworks
 - a) Strategic Plan for the Ministry
 - b) National Water Policy
 - c) National Sanitation Policy
- Legal Frameworks
 - a) Water Resources Act of 2013- establishes a Regulator of Water Resources
 - b) Water Works Act of 1995- under review to establish a regulator of Water Supply and Sanitation
 - a) Sanitation and Hygiene Act- under development and will also establish a regulator of sanitation services

 Note: one Regulator of Water supply and Sanitation services





- A. Water Resources:
 - a) Type: Regulation by Agency
 - b) Name: National Water Resources Authority
- **B.** Water Supply and Sanitation:
 - a) **Type:** Hybrid-Self and Ministerial Regulation
 - b) Nature:
 - Technical Regulation done by Utility companies
 - Economic Regulation done by the Ministry

Direction on Sector Regulation

- Establish independent Regulator of Water Supply and Sanitation (WSS) Services
- Undertaking a study tours to learn from others on the following:
 - a) Technical Regulation
 - b) Economic Regulation
 - c)Effectiveness of different modes of WSS regulation with particular focus on independent Regulator-feasibility assessment
 - d) Feasibility of having one Regulator for WASH sector-Combining Water resources and WSS regulation



2024/25 Priorities (Water Resources)

- Develop new water resources structurtes for socioeconomic development
- Install and institutionalize a real-time groundwater level monitoring system to track fluctuation of groundwater
- Integrate and enforce catchment protection
- Ratify and operationalize transboundary water course agreements with neighboring countries to govern coordinated abstraction from shared water courses
- Rehabilitate and construct water Quality Laboratories.



2024/25 Priorities (Water Supply)

- Establish a maintenance trust fund for sustainability of rural water investments
- Construct piped water supply systems in the rural areas
- Rehabilitate gravity water schemes
- Develop and operationalize urban water supply master plan for all major cities and secondary cities



2024/25 Priorities (Water Supply...cont)

- Develop sustainable WASH facilities and networks in rural and hard to reach areas and all public schools and health facilities
- Conduct research and development of local solutions/technologies to solve local WASH problems
- Introduce professionalized management models for rural water and semi-urban water supply – studies already done



2024/25 Priorities (Sanitation)

- Develop and operationalize waste water management master plan for all major cities and secondary cities
- Accelerate the integration of waste water management within operational framework of the urban water boards, including exploring PPPs for the management of the waste management facilities
- Intensify promotion of good hygiene message



2024/25 Priorities (Sanitation)...cont

- Develop national sanitation investment plan
- Facilitate the transferring of sewerage management from city councils to water utilities



2024/25 Priorities (Human Resources)

- Conduct functional review
- Strengthen the institutional capacities



2024/25 Priorities (Planning)

- Establish a management information system for water and sanitation investments to help inform allocation of new investments
- Coordinate development of new WASH projects for the sector

CHALLENGES

- a) Inadequate financial resources due to
 - Inadequate State funding
 - Imited success in resources mobilization strategy
- a) Frequent occurrence of Climate Related disasters-Destroying available WASH Infrastructure
- b) Regulation gaps leading to inefficient technical management of Water supply and Sanitation services
- c) Inadequate personnel and limited capacity
- d) Vandalism/theft
- e) Unstable Currency leading to rising cost of raw materials

NATIONAL WATER AND SANITATION PROGRAMME

National Water and Sanitation Programme



- The Ministry's immediate aspirations point to Sector Prioritization through <u>a programmatic</u> <u>approach</u>
- The priorities have been derived from the Malawi 2063 First Ten Year Implementation Plan (MIP-1) and the National Water Policy (2023).
- These priorities will form the National Water and Sanitation Programme (2024 – 2034).

National Water and Sanitation Programme.....



- A. Overall Aim of the Programme: To support the realisation of National Vision-Malawi 2063 by focusing on:
 - Job Creation
 - ii. Wealth Creation
 - iii. Food security-supporting agriculture through irrigation
- B. The Programme will also be key in supporting the three pillars: Agricultural Productivity and Commercialization, Industrialization, Urbanization

National Water and Sanitation Programme.....



- The Key Components of the Programme include:
 - Water Resources Development and Management;
 - b) Water Supply Service development
 - c) Sanitation and Hygiene Development
 - d) Regulation, Appraisal, Reporting, Monitoring and Evaluation
 - e) Institutional and Capacity strengthening
